This is my eighth year serving on the board. I have watched all officers particularly the presidents, spend a lot of their own personal finances to support their offices. Myself included. We are all teachers and we are used to providing for our students and classrooms.

We are all still in that same habit in everything we do. This includes all aspects of our professional and personal lives.

The board talked about raising dues previously, but International dues went up and we did not want to hit our state up at the same time. So, what have we done in addition to trying to decrease spending?

- We needed to create the office of VP for Membership due to the increased emphasis for recruiting, maintaining and reinstating new members. Just this biennium alone we have seen three chapters lapsed. We will be honoring 39 sisters at the memorial service on Saturday. The less sisters we have, the less operating funds we have available to maintain our organization. We are thrilled at the initiation of new sisters and the reinstatement of former sisters. As you all know the cost of living has gone up and that puts a strain on our organization as well.
- We have combined the two secretary positions into one.
- This next biennium, the office of sergeant at arms and chaplain will be combined.
- We have changed policies regarding expenditures for travel regarding officers other than the 3 P's and VP for Membership. (Which are required to attend the Gulf and International Conferences.)
- We are trying to use more technology and have plans to use more in the future. Virtual board meeting may be a solution. I know nobody likes changes, but that is the way the future is moving. It only takes a short time to be out of a classroom and finding out things have changed when you walk back into it? Everytime you buy a smart tv or buy a new phone you are faced with changes. You know what I mean.
- Every president has made an effort to come up with some type of ways and means to supplement the operating budget- T-Shirts, Watches, Pins, Garden Flags! Every time you made a purchase you supported us.
- Another way to bring in funds without raising dues is by attending the state convention. That is the way we support each other and our altruistic causes.
- The budget committee has also made recommendations to the board regarding the awarding of the Agnes Miller Mini-Scholarships and it passed. Sisters may apply for this professional development grant to attend Gulf Regional and International Conferences.

Enough! I know we will have discussion at the convention. I thought it was important to point out some things prior to the conference. Jane Crews State, Treasurer has done an excellent job this biennium and her committee has been a wonderful support.


